

# WALLED GARDENS SCULPTURE TRAIL

To the south of the castle are the wonderful Walled Gardens with fabulous flowers, manicured lawns, lovely rose gardens, varieties of fruit with canopies of pear trees traversing the centre section of the second walled garden, to grapes sweltering in the glass house, while plum and apple trees droop with laden branches in the untamed third section. In 1902 the 15th Baron Inchiquin, Lucius, took the old seventeenth century gateway from Leamaneh and erected it at the entrance to this large walled garden, here we begin our contemporary sculpture trail.

Local artists **Carmel Doherty** and **Will Gillchrist** have created a joyous exhibition of contemporary sculpture, site specifically and intuitively designed to enhance the magical exuberance, the kaleidoscope of colour that the flora and fauna protrude, enveloping these magnificent gardens. These sculptors have used a variety of materials, wood, steel, resin and fibreglass to create a transient fantastical stage illuminating the brilliance of this natural environment.

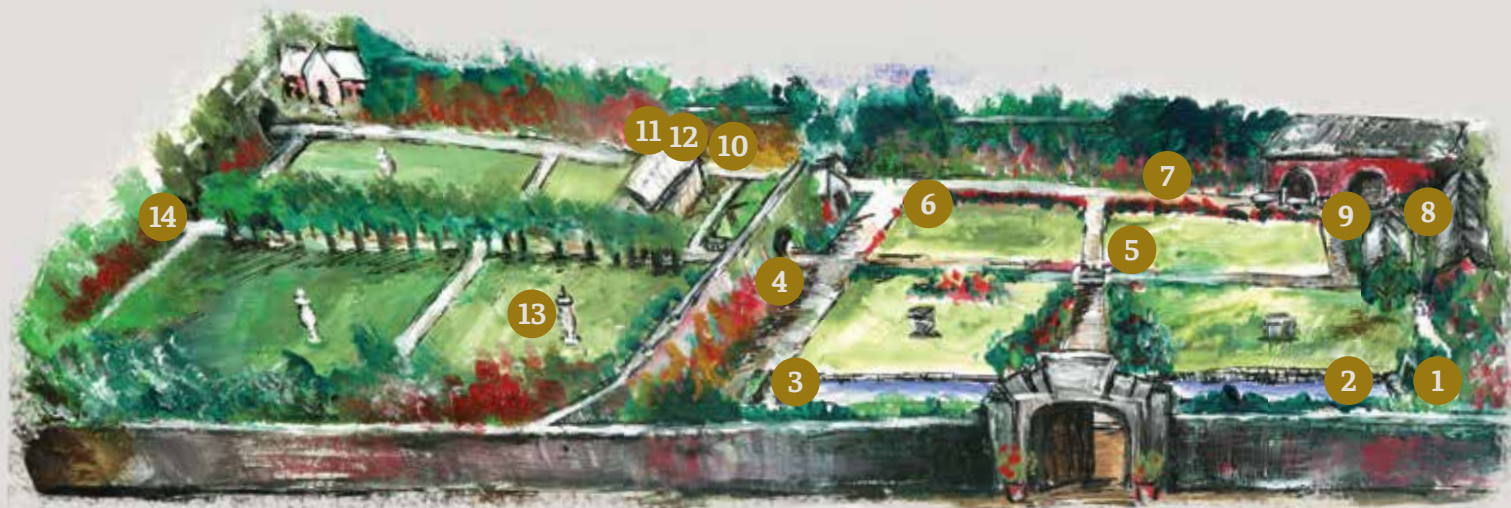
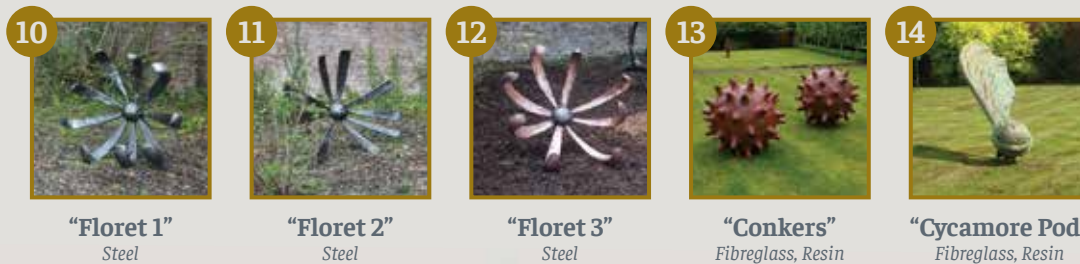
