30 Christmas hotel breaks in Ireland for 2023 – from Santa visits to slap-up meals

Christmas hotel breaks - what's it like to spend Christmas in a hotel? Nicola Brady

Have you ever considered spending Christmas in a hotel?

At first glance, it may seem an impersonal step (and certainly an expensive one). But allow your thoughts to drift a bit. Picture someone else taking care of all the cooking, serving, entertaining and, crucially, the washing-up.

Christmas in a hotel brings lots of organised events, from carols to carriage rides, Santa visits, movie nights or even family portraits. It can allow a larger group of friends or relatives to get together while enjoying the escape hatch of their own rooms, or separate areas to lounge, chat or swim.

A hotel setting could also be the change of scenery a growing family needs — taking the pressure off the cook, the family home and, in some ways, the wallet (in a hotel, it may be easier to spread the cost of drinks, for example). Some hotels not only have rooms, but self-catering lodges on site, and a small but growing number welcome pets. You'll make new memories, too.

Now, your eyes may water when you look at some of the rates. But Christmas hotel breaks at <u>Adare Manor</u>, <u>Cashel Palace</u>, <u>Ashford Castle</u> and <u>Ballynahinch Castle</u> have already sold out for 2024 — some at prices in the thousands of euro.

"Many of our guests make their reservation for the following Christmas while spending Christmas at Ashford Castle," says director of marketing and revenue Regina O'Donoghue. "It's one of our most popular experiences, and by March each year, there are usually only a handful of rooms remaining."

It's only October, however, so there is still availability out there. Some Irish properties have kept their rates the same as last year, but a few have definitely snuck up — I noticed a 20pc increase in some cases.

But it's important to check what the price includes when weighing up the value. Christmas packages tend to bundle everything from mulled wine receptions to champagne breakfasts, Christmas dinner and an evening supper, to meals on the surrounding days. There are usually festive activities, too, and you will often be able to control costs by booking one-, two- or three-night stays.

Here are some ideas to get you started...

Budget (<€600pp)

Limerick Strand Hotel

There's plenty of action here for families, as well as an indoor pool that will keep the kids happy. But the real selling point at Christmas? Children under the age of 12 stay free, with their meals charged on a consumption basis. There are also milk, carrots and cookies for Santa in each family room, and he'll make an appearance on the day itself. If you've been woken at dawn, the 7am breakfast start (complete with Buck's fizz) will be more than welcome.

Salthill Hotel, Co Galway

If you're a fan of the Christmas morning swim, this is the place to be. Set right on the prom, Salthill Hotel is just a few minutes' walk from the Blackrock diving board, where there'll be plenty of Santas taking a dip in the bracing waters in aid of the charity Cope. Afterwards, head back to the whirlpool, sauna and steam room at the hotel, where you can warm the cockles before a five-course Christmas lunch.

Sheraton Athlone, Co Westmeath

While all of the main tourist attractions are closed over Christmas, there's plenty to keep you occupied in Athlone. You can take a Christmas morning walk on the Shannon Banks Nature

Trail, or bring bikes to explore the Greenway. But if you'd rather stay in the hotel, you can make use of the pool or enjoy the live music, which takes place every night over Christmas. There are one- and three-night packages, too.

Farnham Estate, Co Cavan

We all know that Christmas can be stressful. But it would be nigh-on impossible to feel stressed at Farnham. On Christmas Day, you'll wake up to a feast of a breakfast, with the rest of the morning free to wander the estate or make use of the excellent indoor/outdoor pool, before the big meal in the afternoon (and an evening buffet, for good measure). If you want a low-key, calming Christmas, this is the one to beat.

Sligo Park Hotel, Sligo

While most packages are based on two people sharing or a family, it's great to see a well-priced single room. This one is perfect if you're bringing a solo grandparent or relative, or if you just want to do Christmas on your own. There's a candlelit dinner on Christmas Eve with cocktails beforehand, and breakfast is served until noon on Christmas Day — ideal for the late sleepers.

Hodson Bay Hotel, Co Roscommon

Hodson Bay is always a great shout for family breaks, but it comes into its own at Christmas. Santa makes his appearance on Christmas Day, and there are plenty of festive activities for kids. When you need to calm things down, a stroll around the lake will do the trick. The same is on offer over in sister hotel Galway Bay, too.

Redcastle Hotel, Co Donegal

If you have any fussy eaters in your family, the massive carvery selection at the Redcastle Hotel will make for an easy Christmas — there's plenty on offer alongside the usual turkey and ham, so you can go for lamb, pork or even a salmon with seaweed butter. There's a swimming pool and an onsite cinema that'll be showing Christmas movies, and if you did want to stay longer, the four-night package starts at €575pp.

The Metropole, Cork



The Metropole

The Metropole has been open for Christmas for 126 years, so they really know their stuff. "We work very hard to make sure everyone has a good Christmas," says general manager Roger Russell. "We've a few regular guests who come alone and we sit them together, if they're happy to do so. Christmas can be a very lonely time for many people. That's the great thing about spending Christmas at The Metropole — you're not alone."

Fitzwilliam Belfast

Belfast is a cracker of a city at Christmas time, and while the main market shuts up shop on December 22, the decorations and lights still give the whole town a festive vibe. This package at the Fitzwilliam offers great value — all the usual inclusions are still there, with a champagne reception and four-course meal (you can also swap the turkey for venison or sirloin, if you're feeling controversial). While kids are welcome, this one is better suited to couples, rather than families.

Christmas at The Galmont

The Galmont, Galway

Check in on Christmas Eve, and you'll be able to head down to the Galway Christmas Market in Eyre Square, which this year is open for an extended period until January 7. Back at The Galmont, you'll have plenty of festive treats on arrival, before an evening of food and entertainment. Be sure to sneak in a quick session in the outdoor hot tub, too.

The Clarence, Dublin

Dublin is magical at Christmas, and on the day itself, the city is pretty much empty, so you can stroll the streets and feel like you've got the whole town to yourself. The newly refurbed rooms in The Clarence are cosy and cool, but it might be worth upgrading to get more space — the lobby and bars are great, but city hotels don't have the lounging spaces that larger countryside spots have. This package includes breakfast and Christmas dinner.

Ocean Sands, Co Sligo

One of the best-priced packages we've seen, this break still includes all the usual offerings — mince pies on Christmas Eve, the full dinner and buffet on Christmas Day, and live music to boot. You've also got the beach right on your doorstep, so you can walk off all of that turkey and stuffing, and there are dog-friendly rooms, too.

Mid-Range (**<€1,000pp**)

Lough Erne Resort, Co Fermanagh

On a cold, misty morning, the estate at Lough Erne is the perfect backdrop for Christmas. And inside, things are even cosier, with open fires, eggnog and bedtime stories by Mrs Claus on Christmas Eve. There's a caveat, though — unusually, this package doesn't include all of your meals, so if you want dinner on Christmas Eve or a nibble on Christmas evening, it's on an à la carte basis. A five-course Christmas dinner is included though, as is breakfast.

InterContinental Dublin

If you want to wake up in your own bed on Christmas morning, a stay at the InterContinental is a great shout — with its two-night package, you can choose to arrive either on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. And it's a dreamily elegant spot in which to spend a couple of nights, with beautiful decorations and meals served in the swish Seasons restaurant. The in-house pool and thermal suite is a nice addition, and you can even get spa treatments on Christmas Day.

Clontarf Castle

Clontarf Castle, Dublin

They go all out with the decorations at Clontarf Castle, and while the property combines medieval vibes with more modern areas, there's a quirky feel to the whole hotel. On Christmas Day, the big meal is served in the Great Hall, and if you opt for a three- or fournight break, then your dinner is up in the beautiful Fahrenheit restaurant. The Atrium Lobby is a lovely space to hang out in during the day, too.

Newpark Hotel

Newpark Hotel, Kilkenny

If you want to make sure the kids are properly entertained, Newpark is always a safe bet. This Christmas, there will be carol singing, a visit from Santa, festive movies in the cinema and the swimming pool will be open on St Stephen's Day. Even better, the animatronic dinosaurs and adventure playground of Jurassic Newpark will be open on Christmas Day, as will the kids' club, with movies, crafts and games. Be warned, though, this one's booking up fast.

Glasson Lakehouse, Co Westmeath

There's a gorgeous country house feel to Glasson Lakehouse, with roaring fires, squishy sofas and the views of Lough Ree in the background. Even better, the activities don't shut down for Christmas, so you can take a dip in the outdoor pool or make use of the driving range. There are also dog-friendly rooms, and it's not just the kids who get a gift from Santa — your pooch gets festive treats and a Christmas present, too.

The Shelbourne

The Shelbourne, Dublin

Considering what some five-star properties charge, The Shelbourne is well-priced at Christmas time, and the setting is magical, with a giant Christmas tree and beautiful festive displays. While the two-night package isn't all-inclusive, you can choose to have your Christmas feast at lunch or dinner time. And let's face it, after a massive breakfast and a huge Christmas dinner, you'll probably be too stuffed for anything else. You can also stay just for one night, from €530pps.

Break the bank (€1,000pp+)



Glenlo Abbey

Glenlo Abbey, Co Galway

The spirit of cosiness is properly in the air at Glenlo Abbey come Christmas, with open fires, twinkly lights and a full roster of festive movies showing in the plush Abbey movie theatre. Meals are served in the swish River Room Restaurant with the Ffrench Room set up for predinner drinks or nightcaps, and you can have your Christmas Eve dinner in the Pullman Restaurant, made up of two carriages from the Orient Express.

Lough Eske Castle

Lough Eske Castle, Co Donegal

You'll have plenty of time to settle in with this package, which is four nights long as opposed to the usual two. It kicks off on December 23 (though no meals are included on this night), so you'll wake up there on Christmas Eve, with all the usual bells and whistles until you depart on December 27. It's well-priced for kids, with children aged 5-12 costing €389pps if they're sharing your room, or from €581pps if you want to kick them out into their own. Older kids are from €650pps.

Often, some of a hotel's amenities are closed on Christmas Day, even if the property itself is open. Mount Juliet, Co Kilkenny

They're sticking with tradition at Mount Juliet and offering a four-night package for Christmas, so while the price looks a little high, you're getting a solid break away. For that, the majority of meals are included, as well as an afternoon tea on St Stephen's Day and lunch on Christmas Eve. You also get an archery session and Segway tour of the estate, which you can take on December 23 or 26. Accommodation is slightly cheaper (€1,495pps) if you stay in Hunter's Yard, rather than the Manor House. Read our mount Juliet hotel review.

Center Parcs, Co Longford

We've steered away from self-catering packages for this piece, though there are some great options available. An exception was made for <u>Christmas at Center Parcs</u>, where the prices are fairly decent for a three-bed cabin, which sleeps up to six. Sure, you don't get all the bells and whistles included, but you can book in for Christmas lunch in one of three restaurants (€90pp), explore Santa's Woodland Village and the Enchanted Light Garden (included), or book into the Aqua Sana spa, open every day bar Christmas.

Hayfield Manor

Hayfield Manor, Cork

<u>Hayfield Manor</u> has been offering Christmas packages for more than 25 years now, and it has it down to a fine art. Every year, the team (some of whom have worked there for more than 20 years) welcome back families who have spent Christmas there time and time again, from when teenagers were babies. There's a specially themed drinks reception, a turndown gift every night and live entertainment, as well as all the usual meals and visits from Santa.
